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1.0 Building institutional capacity for bioethics training in Nigeria

a. Building awareness of the new Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities, University of Ibadan, Nigeria

The new Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities recently established at the University of Ibadan. Nigeria will be the academic home of the Bioethics training program going forward after being hosted by the Department of Surgery since its inception. This further ensures institutionalization and sustainability of bioethics training in Nigeria.

In order to create awareness of the new department, its faculty members, led by Prof. T. O. Ogundiran – the pioneer Head of Department paid a courtesy visit on the Provost of the Postgraduate College, University of Ibadan. During the meeting, Prof. Ogundiran informed the Provost about the history of the Bioethics program and how it was started in the Department of Surgery, Ibadan through a grant from the U.S. National Institutes of Health (NIH). Professor Ogundiran mentioned that members of the new Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities received training in modern bioethics from Universities in Canada, the United States and Europe. He said the main thrust of the group's work over the years has been the establishment of the academic program in Bioethics at the Postgraduate College of the University of Ibadan, building awareness of bioethics in Nigeria and training ethics committees.

Prof. Babalola, the Provost of the Postgraduate College responded by saying the Bioethics program was not new to the Postgraduate College, but the Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities certainly is. He said the Postgraduate College has been managing the admission, training and successful completion of the program by students since the inception of the program. He said the College will do everything possible to support the new department. The members of the Department thanked the Provost for his time and took a group photograph with him.

Members of the Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities also paid a courtesy visit on Prof. Babatunde Ekanola, the acting Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ibadan. The purpose of the visit was to create awareness for the new department and solicit the support of the Vice-Chancellor on a collaboration between the Center for Bioethics and Research, the new department and the Research Management Office of the University of Ibadan.

The Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities and the Center for Bioethics and Research plan to collaborate with the Research Management Office (RMO) of the University of Ibadan to strengthen Research Integrity in the Institution. The objective of the collaboration is to further the development of research integrity and responsible conduct of research in Nigeria

b. Developing bioethics training programs in Nigerian institutions. CBR is working with the institutional leadership at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka (UNN) and the Olabisi Onabanjo University, Ago-Iwoye to develop and implement new Master's degree programs in bioethics in their institutions.

Recommended trainees from the two institutions were given preferential admission into the University of Ibadan MSc Bioethics degree program. They have successfully completed the program and defended their thesis. They will join other trainees of the Bioethics program who will convocate at the University of Ibadan later this year.

Dr. Ijeoma Ezeome is from the University of Nigeria Nsukka and her research project was titled 'Advancing the need for regulation of assisted reproductive technology in Nigeria: Practitioner perspectives and clients experiences'.

Dr. Olusola Sunday Aluko-Arowolo is from the Olabisi Onabanjo University Ago-Iwoye. His research project was

titled 'Dispositional and Contextual Differences in Perceived Hindrances in Research regulation Compliance and Suggested Remedies among Social Science Researchers in Selected South-West Nigeria Universities'. Dr. I. Ezeome and O. Aluko-Arowolo will return to their institutions and form the core faculty of their Bioethics program.

2.0 Building institutional capacity for Responsible Conduct of Research in Nigeria

CBR, the Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities (DBMH) and the University of Maryland School of Medicine are collaborating with the Research Management Offices (RMO) in institutions across Nigeria to strengthen Responsible Conduct of Research. Prof. T. O. Ogundiran, the academic director of CBR held a virtual meeting with the leadership of Mountain Top University (MTU), Makogi-Oba, Ogun State, one of the target institutions, on strengthening the RMO in the institution and the benefits of the collaboration for the University.

The Center for Bioethics and Research will provide training and support to strengthen the institution's Research Management Offices (RMO) and their staff. CBR will sponsor an academic member of each University to complete an MSc/PhD program in Bioethics with concentration on Research Integrity and return to their institutional RMO in carrying out it's activities.

3.0 M.Sc. Bioethics Program, University of Ibadan

The Center for Bioethics and Research continues to support the implementation of the highly successful Master's degree program in Bioethics at the University of Ibadan. The Postgraduate College of the University of Ibadan recommended 12 students for admission into the program for the 2020/2021academic session. This will be the first set of students to be admitted since the new Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities was established.
