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# The Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities (DBMH) University of Ibadan.

#### 1.1 Ratification of the Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities (DBMH) University of Ibadan.

The Senate of the University of Ibadan ratified the Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities (DBMH) as a full – fledged department in the Faculty of Multidisciplinary Studies on the 3rd of August, 2023.

The DBMH trains students admitted for Masters degree program and Ph.D. Program in Bioethics at the University of Ibadan. The Center for Bioethics and Research (CBR) Nigeria provides support for the department in these activities.

#### 1.2 MSc Bioethics (Research Ethics)

The Department of Bioethics and Medical Humanities (DBMH) at the University of Ibadan has received 13 expression of interest letters from individuals interested in applying for the Bioethics program at the commencement of the next academic session. Our current set of trainees are on their final set of course work, they will start working on their final research projects at the end of their coursework.

Trainees are fully supported with learning materials by the Center for Bioethics and Research (CBR) Nigeria.

# 1.3 Admission into M.Sc. Bioethics (RCR) degree at University of Ibadan, Nigeria.

These trainings are part of the requirements by the National Health Research Ethics Committee (NHREC) for registration of newly inaugurated Ethics Committees and renewal of registration for existing HRECs.

# 3.2 Human Subjects Protection training in collaboration with BRANY-Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI), New York.

We provided the following online trainings to biomedical researchers and students in Nigeria - 867 in Protection of Human Subjects of Research, 1,356 on the Nigerian National Code for Health Research Ethics, 481 in Good Clinical Practice, and 77 in Conflicts of Interest, and 321 in Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR) from the 1st of January 2024 till 30th of March 2024.

# 3.3 Online training in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI), Safe Working and Sexual Harassment free Environment (SWSHE) in Nigeria.

CBR has launched new courses on 'Safe Working Environment and Sexual Harassment free Environment' as part of our programs for building capacity of biomedical researchers in Nigeria. The main objective of the course is to educate, inform, protect, empower, and support the research community in confronting all forms of sexual misconduct and harassment in the workplace. Sexual harassment undermines the integrity of working relationships and interferes with the right of individuals to work and learn in an environment free from harassment. 
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
